THE COMMUNITY:

Lake Oswego is a suburban residential area eight miles from Portland, Oregon, with a population of approximately 37,000. It is primarily comprised of business and professional people.

THE SCHOOL:

Lake Oswego is a four-year comprehensive high school with a rigorous academic curriculum. Having attained the highest SAT scores in the Portland Metro Southwest area, and as one of Oregon's highest academic ranking high schools, LOHS is accredited through the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. Enrollment is 1286 students. There are 76 faculty members. Each school day consists of four periods on an alternative day rotation.

CLASS RANK:

There is no weighted grading at Lake Oswego High School. All courses are weighted equally. However, Lake Oswego School District policy calls for the computation of two class rankings. One is based on the student's cumulative grade point average after the sixth, seventh, and eighth semesters. Another is based on a recalculation of the student's grade point average based on participation in certain classes. Those classes are Honors English, Honors/A.P. English, Pre Calculus, A.P. Calculus, A.P. Calculus II, A.P. Statistics, A.P. Physics, A.P. Biology, Honors Chemistry, A.P. Chemistry, A.P. U.S. History, A.P. Government, A.P. European History, A.P. Economics, A.P. 3D Art, A.P. Art Studio, and fourth and fifth year of second language.

COLLEGE ATTENDANCE:

In June of 2010, 90 percent of 275 graduates indicated that they planned to enroll in two and four year colleges and universities. Of these, 46 percent planned to enroll in colleges in Oregon, 44 percent planned to attend college out of state, and 16 percent indicated they would enroll in a two-year community college program.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT:

Lake Oswego High School students have performed at a consistently high level in the SAT, the National Merit Scholarship, and the Advanced Placement programs.
